

XXIII. WITHDRAWAL FROM THE COLLEGE OF LAW

A. Withdrawal from the College of Law

A student who is considering discontinuing his or her legal education by completely withdrawing from the College of Law is strongly urged to consult with the Associate Dean for Student Services and/or the Associate Dean for Academics before making a final decision.

If a student decides to completely withdraw from law school, he or she should do so officially. One who wishes to withdraw during the first three weeks of law study should provide a formal email notice to the Registrar. One who wishes to withdraw after the first three weeks of law study should submit a email statement of intent to the Associate Dean for Student Services. Taking these steps will result in a transcript with a “Withdrawn” notation. Failure to officially withdraw will result in the grade of F being assigned in every course.

B. Resuming Law Study after Withdrawal from the College of Law

A student who has withdrawn from law school while in good academic standing who later wishes to resume law study will be required to reapply for admission to the College of Law.
