### Marriage Equality and Family Formation



- The 14<sup>th</sup> amendment Due Process Clause fundamental liberty interest and equal protection protects right to marry by same-sex couples
- Justice Kennedy highlights safeguarding children as a basis for protecting the right to marry
- Notes marriage "affords the permanency and stability important to children's best interests"

#### Demographic Research on Same-Sex Parenting



- Survey results from 2024 study by The Williams Institute, UCLA School of Law
- About 25% of married same-sex couples under age 50 have children
- Over 40% of married same-sex couples indicate they want to have children
- Participants said marriage's stability and security a prerequisite to becoming parents

### Options for Medically-Assisted Reproduction

- Therapeutic Donor Insemination (TID)
- In Vitro Fertilization (IVF)
- Egg Donation
- Embryo Donation
- Surrogacy (Traditional and Gestational)
- Intravaginal Culture (IVC)
- In Vitro Gametogenisis (IVG)



### Current Usage of ART by the LGBTQ+ Community



Use of donor sperm (mostly by cis females, transmen)

- Estimated 40% sperm bank clients are lesbian couples
- About 60,000 children born via sperm donation each year Use of surrogacy (mostly by cis male individuals and male couples)
  - Estimated 20% of donor eggs secured by S/S male couples
  - About 5,000 children born via surrogacy each year in U.S.
  - Agencies report up to 50% of clients are S/S male couples
  - Some gestational carriers prefer only male couples



### Barriers to Accessing Assisted Reproductive Care


- Cost
  - Average cost of single IVF cycle is \$20k
  - Average cost of securing donor eggs is \$20k to 60k
  - Surrogacy costs ranges from \$100k to \$250k
  - Most insurance does not cover fertility care
  - Private health insurance market is improving
- Provider Discretion and Discrimination
  - 2005 study 48% ART clinics not accept S/S male couples
  - Over 53% would not accept single male as client
  - Today, many target advertising to LGBTQ+ market





## Looking Ahead: Can One Person Be Both Biologic Mother and Father?

- IVG proceeds in animal models
- Success in developing opposite-sex gametes in mice
- Success in live birth using one opposite-sex gamete
- No live birth using IVG-derived gametes from one source (yet)
- Human trials not yet underway
